- **NEW!** Smart Controllers 50% of cost up to \$1000 (instead of by stations)
- Landscape Rebates up to \$20,000 thru end of 2026 for commercial
- Gardens at Heather Farm round robin 60 participated very fun! Garden is in good shape!
- **NEW!** USBR grant submitted to support commercial lawn conversions \$500,000 to help with design, GIS, and rebates

Discussion - Revisiting the Low Water Plant List (notes from 12/2022) 2:10 pm

- Plant list updates The goal is to update the EBMUD plant list with more specificity to climate zones and biodiversity. Reviewed the eco-region zones listed on new Bay Area Garden Planner: https://bayarea.calscape.org/
- APLD Slow the Burn Dona noted APLD will likely be doing a presentation series on grasses/groundcovers and will share info.
 - Past approach included evaluating water use; bird/butterfly friendly; summer-dry; flowering season; evergreen or deciduous; availability; notinvasive; native
 - What is the current recommended approach?
 - Is it possible to break up east and west of the hills?
 - Review San Diego's Nifty Fifty
 - Kristin to send the excel of the top 140 for notes on east and west of the hills, fire concerns, and availability etc.
 - Based on input may make one handout for top 40 plants that would do well on either side – similar to the Nifty Fifty.
 - A large electronic list can be filter for east or west of the hills
 - Jessica to cross tabulate existing list with Calscape East Bay list
 - Stew to note availability and east west recommendations.
 - Emphasis though not totally on native plants
 - Karly to get into on current Low Water Plant list from colleagues.
 - Sell whole gardens; Group likes the idea of more pictures to demonstration before and after with the design. Maybe the garden tour, photo contest, or designer would be

willing to share. San Diego Authorities flipchart may also be handy.
